42nd Annual SCNA Convention Highlights



The South Carolina Numismatic Association held its 42nd Annual convention at the TD Convention Center in Greenville, S.C., on Oct 24-26, 2014. One of the many highlights of the convention was the SCNA Young Numismatist Exhibits, Saturday's Educational Programs, and the First SCNA Coin Club Exhibit Competition.

The New Coin Club Exhibit competition provided convention attendees with a look back into the history of South Carolina. This year's theme was **"Numismatics in South Carolina"**. Congratulations to the Midlands Coin Club for winning First place in this first ever coin club exhibit competition. Midlands Coin Club took home \$250.00 for their club. Exhibit judging was by popular vote of the public attending the convention. More details regarding this club and it's winning exhibit can be found on page 20.

Public attendance for the 2014 show increased over 2013 with a noticeably larger crowd on Friday. Dealer participation was down slightly compared to 2013 but with attendance up the floor stayed busy. SCNA Youth membership continues to grow, so does their interest in all areas of Numismatics as demonstrated by the increasing number of Youth Exhibitors and youth in attendance. Youth attendance for the entire convention remains strong with the majority of youth attending on Saturday alone. The Saturday youth program continues to attract youth from all over the state. All youth signing in at the Young Numismatist table were entered into a drawing for door prizes. Sixty-one youth signed up at YN table. Winners of the door prizes were Sammy Graham of Easley (1st) and Katherine Crum (2nd) of Greenville.

A big **Thank You** to Arthur Darr who worked the YN table (along with other



volunteers) and helps with the convention YN programs.

The "Young Numismatist Exhibitors" competed for 1st 2nd and 3rd place prizes. The first place winner was awarded a 1st Place certificate and \$100 in show gift certificates. The second place winner received a 2nd place certificate and \$70 in show gift certificates, and the third place winner received a 3rd place certificate and \$50 in show gift certificates. All others were awarded an Honorable Mention Certificate of Accomplishment and \$20 in show gift certificates.

This is the second year of the Show Cash Gift Certificate Program but the first year of the "Show Note".

Youth attendees were given a Lincoln Cent folder and piles of Lincoln cents to sort through to fill their folders. At the conclusion of the program youth exhibitors were announced; certificates of accomplishment were awarded and show note gift certificates were distributed.

The YN's were turned loose on the bourse floor to seek out treasures to add to their collections with over 65 dealers to visit.



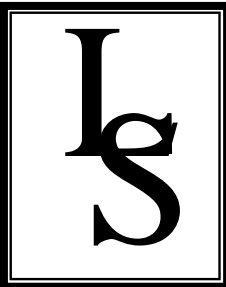

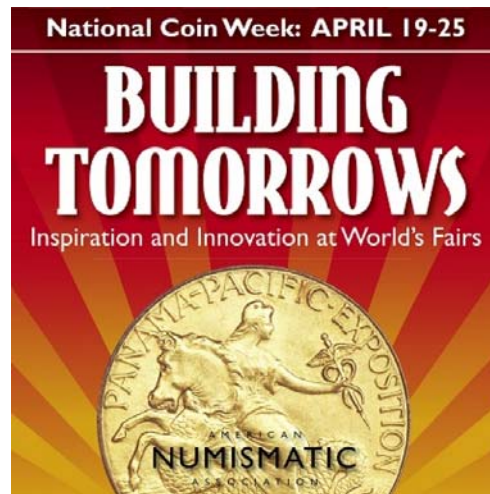
HISTORY OF NATIONAL COIN WEEK

National Coin Week began in 1923, when ANA Governor Julius Gutttag suggested to ANA President Moritz Wormser that a week-long event should be established “to attract the general public to our hobby and consequently increase our

membership, and aid in our science.” That December, the first announcement of a “Coin Week” was made in *The Numismatist* and scheduled for the week of February 9-16, 1924.

The first NCW was a success, and discussion ensued in 1924 about establishing an annual event. The following year, the name was changed to “Old Coin Week,” and the event was planned for February 15-21. In 1925 Wormser said, “Let us all work together for the accomplishments of the principles for which the ANA was founded: To disperse numismatic knowledge . . . to demonstrate that numismatics is an educational and entertaining pursuit . . . and to imbue other collectors with your own enthusiasm and love for the subject.”

Coin Week enjoyed successful observances in 1926 and 1927 under President H.H. Yawger. But, from 1928 to 1938, the ANA did not actively promote the event, and it existed in name only. In 1939 member Lee Hewitt of Chicago proposed that the ANA reinstate Coin Week as “National Coin Week.” President J. Henri Ripstra confirmed a new March date and announced that prizes would be given to clubs and individuals who accomplished the most during the week. In 1942 the observance was moved to the third full week of April, where it has remained ever since.



Anatomy of a \$1 Bill



A. Plate Position Letters and Numbers - Current bills are printed using a 32-subject printing plate. This number indicates the position of the note on that plate. Notice the letter appears both in the upper left corner and the bottom right corner of each bill.

B. Federal Reserve Bank Number - This number, repeated four times on the face of the bill. Each bank has its own letter and number, as follows:

A-Boston	G-Chicago
B-New York	H-St. Louis
C-Philadelphia	I-Minneapolis
D-Cleveland	J-Kansas City
E-Richmond	K-Dallas
F-Atlanta	L-San Francisco

C. Federal Reserve Bank Seal - The seal represents the issuing Federal Reserve Bank, one of 12 in the US. See B for specific FRB letter.

D. Serial Number - Appearing twice identically on the face of each note, the serial number is the unique feature of each bill. The serial number includes prefix and suffix letters.

E. Series Date - The series date represents the year the design of a particular note originated, not necessarily the year it was released or printed. Series date may also change when a major revision is made to a bill. Minor changes to bill design are noted by adding a letter to the series year, i.e. "1969C" or "1977A".

F. Treasury Seal - This seal represents the Department of the Treasury, established 1789. The current seal (Federal Reserve Notes) is green, though different colors have been used on past bills.

G. Plate Serial Number - This number, different than the Plate Position Number, represents the actual printing plate used to print the note.

Hello Young Collectors! The 2014 collecting season is gone but 2015 starts a new year for searching for interesting coins and currency for our collections. Did you find all of the 2014 America the Beautiful quarters (Great Smoky Mountains National Park-Tennessee, Shenandoah National Park-Virginia, Arches National Park-Utah, Great Sand Dunes National Park-Colorado, and Everglades National Park-Florida)? Were you lucky enough to find examples from all three mints (remember San Francisco is making business strike quarters)? Now it is time to look for the 2015 quarters: Homestead National Monument of America Park- Nebraska; Kisatchie National Forest-Louisiana; Blue Ridge Parkway- North Carolina; Bombay Hook National Wildlife Refuge- Delaware; and Saratoga National Historic Park- New York.

The big news for 2014 was the Austin M. Sheheen, Jr. YN scholarship winner, Shelby Plooster, attended the ANA Summer Seminar in Colorado Springs, Colorado. The second 2014 scholarship winner, Andrew Grischuk, elected to attend the Seminar in 2015. Each winner will receive \$2000.00 to be used for one week's tuition to the American Numismatic Association (ANA) Summer Seminar in Colorado Springs, Colorado, room and board, and airfare. The ANA Summer Seminar has two one-week sessions with a large assortment of courses taught by some of the foremost experts in their field. Additional sight-seeing tours, such as the Denver Mint, are also available during the week.

For more information on the Summer Seminar and ANA-sponsored scholarships visit www.money.org. The SCNA sponsored one new YN scholarship for 2015 (application deadline was December 31, 2014). The deadline for 2016 applications and supporting materials is December 31, 2015. Application forms with guidelines are available from the SCNA Secretary or can be found in the *Scanner*.

Special congratulations to Shelby Plooster! She was honored as the 2014 SCNA Young Numismatist of the Year at the Saturday YN program at the Convention. This is the top award for young collectors and has not been presented for many years. Also, Shelby took home the 1st place award and prize for her YN exhibit. This follows her 2014 win of a Sheheen YN scholarship and completion of the ANA Summer Seminar course in U.S. coin grading. Keep up the outstanding work!

The national debate continues on the need for a one cent coin to be produced by the United States. Many countries, including our neighbor Canada, have already dropped their low denomination coinage without much problem being reported. Regardless what other countries have done, should we do away with the Lincoln cent? Any opinions?

2014 marked the 100th birthday for one of the most popular key coins in the Lincoln series, the 1914-D cent. With a mintage of 1,193,000 (3rd lowest of the Lincoln cents) the coin has always been difficult to find. Most were put into circulation and few were held for collectors. The coin was so important and valuable some people have tried to add a Denver mint-mark to a 1914-P or alter the first 4 of a 1944-D Lincoln cent and pass it off as a 1914-D (there is no V.D.B. on the shoulder of a genuine 1914-D cent). A good example will cost about \$200.00 but you need to be sure it is an original problem-free coin.



Start making plans to attend the 2015 SCNA State Convention at the TD Convention Center in Greenville, S.C. The 3-day 2014 Convention had over 100 tables of numismatic items; there was a special YN Table for the young



collectors; the YN Exhibition Program had nice awards and gift certificates for the winners; and a free Saturday YN education program with a Lincoln cents search and gift certificates for each participant was held. Check out the Convention pictures on the SCNA web-site at WWW.SC-NA.ORG.

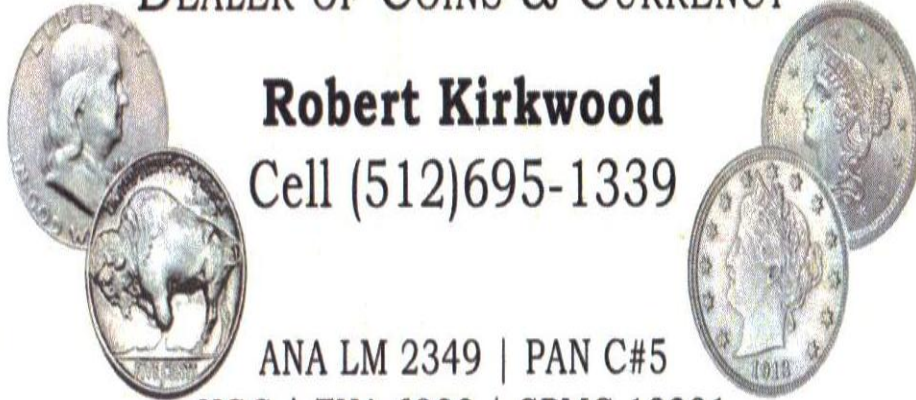
