FORT MOULTRIE (FORT SUMTER NATIONAL MONUMENT) QUARTER

The final quarter of 2016 will be the **Fort Moultrie (Fort Sumter National Monument) Quarter**. It will be the thirty-fifth quarter released as part of the United States Mint America the Beautiful Quarters® Program. As with the other quarters in 2016, the final design for this quarter will not be known until probably late in 2015. The quarter candidates can be viewed on line and are pictured here.

The Fort Moultrie (Fort Sumter National Monument) Quarter will contain the same obverse as found on all of the other America the Beautiful Coins – a portrait of George Washington, the first President of the United States, as designed by John Flanagan.

What is your choice for this National Monument found in our wonderful state?

Who is the soldier on this coin and what significant role did he play during the Battle of Fort Sullivan during the Revolutionary War?

Facts for Fort Moultrie and Sgt William Jasper (Fort Sumter National Monument)

Fort Moultrie of South Carolina was named after Colonial William Moultrie, who was the commander at the yet to be finished fort when the British attacked in 1776. The original name of the fort was Fort Sullivan but changed after the Battle to honor of William Moultrie and the 2nd South Carolina Regiment. Fort Moultrie is located on beautiful Sullivan's Island on the coast of South Carolina outside of Charleston. The island sits at the opening of the harbor into Charleston and is considered a strategic military point to provide protection to the city.



The individual on the majority of the coins for selection is Sergeant William Jasper.

Sgt Jasper was a German immigrant who settled in the south after working as an indentured servant to repay his fare (a common practice during that time). Jasper could not read or write but was loyal to his new country. During the battle of Fort Sullivan, the flag for the fort was shot down by British fire. Jasper recovered the flag and created a new pole using a cannon sponge staff. The flag flew high until the British retreated after the ten hour battle was over. Sgt Jasper was considered a hero after this battle and was honored by the Governor. He continued to fight for his country with a roving commission, but during the Siege of Savannah he was mortally wounded and died in 1779.

The flag recovered by Sgt. Jasper was designed by Col. Moultrie and called the Fort Sullivan or Moultrie flag.



Our current state flag bears a resemblance to the Moultrie flag.

This year the SCNA Convention will again host the annual exhibits program for YN's, Adults as well as member clubs. The SCNA Club Exhibit Program is easy! Your club must register it's exhibit before Oct 1, 2015. You may use 1 or 2 cases provided by the SCNA or bring your own. Each club must build it's exhibit around a central theme.

This year's theme is "**Transportation Numismatics in South Carolina**". You may use coins, currency and tokens in your exhibit from members of your club only. All items must have a South Carolina place of interest associated with them. Judging will be by popular vote of the public attending the convention. Any items within the exhibit that do not have a South Carolina place of interest associated with them will result in the disqualification of the exhibit. Set up is Thursday from 5PM till 9PM and Friday from 8 AM until Noon. Voting will continue thru Saturday. The winning exhibit will be announced at the SCNA Awards Breakfast on Sunday morning. This is a club event. We highly encourage each club to pool their club resources and member collections together for this event. ANA RESEARCH SERVICES

Education, information and research are critical to the full enjoyment of numismatics. The ANA Library staff happily helps members find answers to their numismatic questions.

Research

For basic requests and questions, the library staff will provide answers at no charge.

For in-depth research requests (which typically involve 7-10 sources), the library staff can provide information on any numismatic subject or question. Using the library's extensive holdings, staff also can produce bibliographies of books and articles on any topic.

The research fee is \$50 per hour (minimum one-hour) plus any photocopy or digital scanning charges. Library staff can provide an estimate of the time needed to complete a project or patrons may specify a maximum monetary amount.

Photocopies

The library staff can photocopy pages from books, magazines and auction catalogs and mail them anywhere in the world. Patrons will receive the articles along with a list of sources and citation information.

Fees for this service:

.25 cents per copy with a minimum charge of \$5 for ANA members

.50 cents per copy with a minimum charge of \$10 for nonmembers

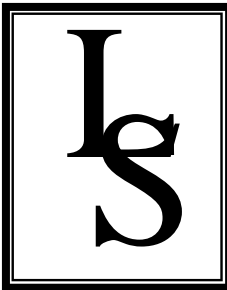
Digital scanning

Digital scans are available for various library materials, including books, periodicals and auction catalogs. For requests of three scans or more, there is a preparatory and supplies fee of \$20.

Fees for this scanning:

Low-resolution scans (200 dpi and under): \$2 a page for ANA members, \$4 for non-members

High-resolution scans (201 dpi and over): \$5 a page for ANA members, \$10 for non-members

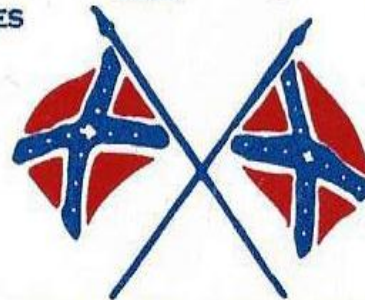

The YN Corner

If any young reader finds something very unusual in circulation, please contact me. I would like to share your find with the other searchers.

Greetings Young Collectors! I am writing this column at the end of April, 2015, and by this time coins from this year's minting should have been widely distributed. However, from the circulating coinage I have received about a dozen 2015-P cents, three 2015-P dimes and one 2015-P America the Beautiful quarter. I have not received any nickels or any coins from the Denver mint. The apparent failure of new coins reaching the general public is very discouraging for the casual or beginner collector of coins.

If the young numismatists are having problems finding new coins for their collection they should consider joining a local coins club, visiting a coin dealer or attending a coin show. New coins can still be purchased from the U.S. Mint but they can be very expensive for a young collector. Other sources of coins exist. There are auctions, which includes buying from EBAY; large, national coin dealers and companies that offer introductory items but may try to put customers on a purchasing plan; fancy ads in newspapers and magazines offering a "once in a lifetime opportunity" to purchase special coins that actually have little real value; pawnbrokers and precious metal brokers; and businesses or persons offering coins for sale in numismatic periodicals or newspaper ads. While these options may appear to offer deals, beginning buyers should carefully consider what is being purchased and if the price is appropriate.

What is a good Young Numismatist to do? As I have mentioned in the past, there are many other areas to consider for starting a collection. First, continue to search pocket change for older coins still in circulation and look for obvious error coins. Also, think about collecting foreign coins. A favorite area of collecting is different types of obsolete U.S. coins. Many people collect U.S. and foreign currency. Finally, think about collecting tokens or other exnumia.

Tokens come in many types such as political tokens, transportation tokens, merchant tokens, Civil War tokens, tax tokens, as well as many other categories.

There continues to be much national discussion on several items. The idea of discontinuing the U.S. cent has been debated for several years. Although the one cent coin has been in use for over 200 years in recent years it has become more expensive to make than the coin is worth. Also its buying power is very small. The love-hate relationship with the lowly cent will likely continue for some time. The other current issue is who should replace Andrew Jackson on the \$20.00 bill? Many believe the new face should be of a famous woman while some have other ideas for a new face. I would still like to hear from my readers if they have an opinion or a comment on these items.

SCNA has chosen the winner of the 2015 Austin M. Sheheen, Jr. Young Numismatist Scholarship, Mr. Daniel Todd Hammond, Jr. of the Anderson Area Coin Club. The 17 year old joins the 2014 winners, Ms. Shelby Plooster and Mr. Andrew Grischuk, of the \$2000.00 scholarship to attend the American Numismatic Association Summer Seminar in Colorado Springs, Colorado. It was also announced there will be one new scholarship available for 2016. The YN scholarship is open to all SCNA members ages 13 to 18. Applications with scholarship guidelines can be found in this issue of the SCanner, the official publication of the SCNA or obtained from Pascal Brock, SCNA Secretary, P.O. Box 693, Lugoff, SC 29078. All completed applications and supporting documents must be returned and postmarked by December 31.

April 9, 2015, marked the 150th anniversary of the end of the Civil War but of special note is April 15, 2015, the 150th anniversary of the death of the 16th President, Abraham Lincoln. The following is a list of firsts concerning Lincoln. How many were you aware of?

1. Lincoln was born in 1809 in Kentucky. He was the first president born outside the original 13 states.
2. He likely held more jobs than any other president- laborer, farmer, post master, river boat pilot, inventor, soldier, store clerk, store owner, licensed bar tender (Lincoln did not personally drink or smoke), wrestler (Lincoln is in the Wrestling Hall of Fame), lawyer, judge, state legislator, federal legislator, U.S. president, etc.
3. Lincoln was the first major politician to recommend that women be given the right to vote (1836).
4. He was the first Republican elected president.
5. He was the tallest president at 6'4" (but over 7' tall with his stovepipe hat on).
6. He was the first president with a beard (suggested by a young girl in New York to make him look more handsome).
7. He was the first and only president with a patent (he invented a flotation device to get a river boat off sand bars).
8. He was one of the first people to appear on the new U.S. currency introduced during the Civil War (the 1861 ten-dollar greenback).

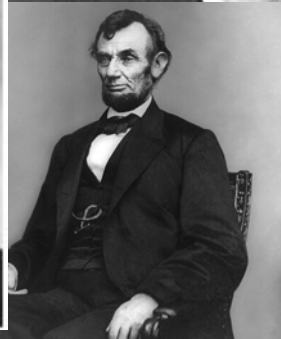
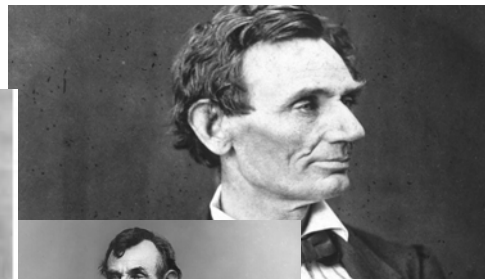
9. He was the first U. S. president to be assassinated. (The legislation for the creation of the Secret Service was on Lincoln's desk on the evening he went to Ford's Theater. However, the Secret Service was not created for the protection of the President- it was started to fight counterfeiting of money.)
10. Lincoln was the first real person to appear on circulating U.S. coinage. Lincoln's likeness has appeared on more coins than all the other coins combined.

Lincoln currently appears on the U.S. cent and the five dollar bill.

The 2015 SCNA State Convention will be October 30, 31, and November 1 at the TD Convention Center in Greenville, South Carolina. Admission is free to the public. As in past years, every day there will be an YN table with free items and information suitable for the young collector. On Saturday afternoon an YN Education Program will be presented and YN's will receive a gift package at the end of the program. The awards have been improved for the YN's who have exhibits at this year's Convention. Arrangements can be made for YN's to set up, have their exhibit judged, and receive his or her award all on Saturday. Awards will be presented during the Saturday YN Education program. An application to exhibit and the contact person can be found within this issue of the SCanner. Exhibiting is free to members of SCNA. The Sunday morning SCNA Award's breakfast is also free to current members of the organization. Now is the time to start planning to attend this year's Convention. Early Paper Money Mottos and Denominations of South Carolina 1760- 1793

A **motto** (derived from the Latin *muttum*, 'mutter', by way of Italian *motto*, 'word', 'sentence') is a maxim, a phrase meant to formally summarize the general motivation, goal, ideal or intention of an individual, family, social group or organization. Mottos are usually not expressed verbally, unlike slogans, but are expressed in writing and usually stem from long traditions of social foundations, or also from significant events, such as a civil war or a revolution. A motto may be in any language, but Latin is the most used in the Western World (*American Heritage and Webster Dictionary Resource*).

All South Carolina issues are not listed here- just those found to have a Motto on the note itself. The mottos are in Latin with the translation to follow. Information used for this publication is from **The Early Paper Money of America** 5th ed Eric P. Newman. All notes included in this list were scanned images from the private collection of Hugh Shull.

Our earliest paper money issues originated from the Act of May 8, 1703, a little over 30 years after South Carolina's proprietary period began in 1670. The denominations for these issues were based on the British monetary/currency system and terms. Pound Sterling originating in the late 700 A.D. was used in the colonial states from the earliest settlement. As part of the Pound Sterling (£) system; shilling (s) and pence (d) are fractions of a Pound Sterling. The conversion for this system was twelve pence (12d or 12 pennies) per shilling and twenty shillings (20s) per pound (£).

The symbol for the pound is £, based on the letter L for *libra*, which was the basic Roman unit of weight just as the pound is the basic English unit of weight. Shillings were abbreviated s, which didn't stand for shillings but for *solidus*, a Roman coin. Pence were abbreviated d, which stands for *denarius*, a smaller Roman coin. (Sometimes *p* was used to stand for pounds, as well.) £12 10s. 6d. then, was twelve pounds, ten shillings and sixpence.

Often, values were written in a short hand that looks like decimal numbers — for example, £2.11.05 is two pounds, eleven shillings, and five pence. Sometimes colons were used instead of periods (£2:11:05).

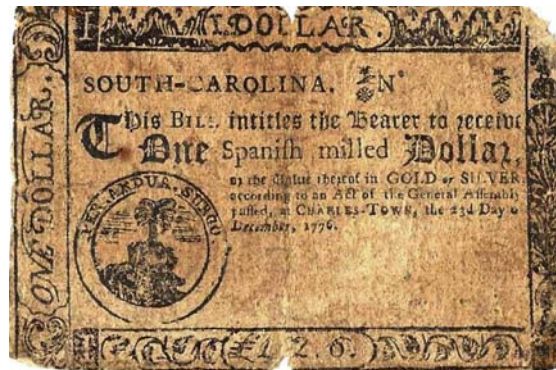

68th Ed 2015 Whitman Publishing

Mintages are written as 1958/2015 in the table. None means no mintage listed in reference. Grade is the grade listed in the reference for the price that is for both- for many series Fine was the highest grade listed in the 1958 book while in 2015 there were much higher grades listed. If the coin had no lower grades listed (example 1876-CC 20 Cent piece) the lowest grade value is listed. In some circumstances even the mintages documented changed-example 1895-P Morgan dollar; with no explanation in the 1958 book, the mintages are 12,000 higher than in 2015.

As with any reference or guide, keep in mind it is just that- a guide. These prices may not reflect true auction result values for the coin. It is interesting to see which coins took some major leaps while others did not even with lower mintages. Have some fun with this list, make your own list of coins that have gone up in value or those who did not due to new collections coming to market. If you had been collecting in 1958 what series would you have focused on and would it have paid off?

YOUNG NUMISMATIST EXHIBIT RULES 2015

Each exhibitor must submit a separate application for each category or class of exhibits being entered. Exhibitors must be a member of the SCNA.

The exhibit application(s) must reach the address of the responsible person on the application by the date specified.

SCNA officers, judges of exhibits, or their families shall not place judged exhibits.

Non-competitive exhibits are permitted for these persons.

All materials in exhibits must be authentic. Any replicas, forgeries, or counterfeit materials must be labeled as such.

Exhibits may not advertise any contents for sale or have any statement of price or value.

There will be no identification as to ownership or reference to the person displaying the material submitted for display.

Up to 4 exhibit cases may be provided by the SCNA to exhibitors for use at the convention.

Exhibitors may use their own cases provided total space does not exceed space of 4 SCNA cases.

All cases must lie flat on the tables provided.

No electrical outlets will be provided.

No titles or placards or numismatic material of any kind may be placed outside the exhibit cases.

Exhibits of material not capable of being presented in the usual cases will be permitted only upon prior and specific arrangement with the exhibit chairperson and subject to the concurrence of the executive board chairperson (President).

In the event of any question of the legality of any material submitted for display, the decision of the SCNA President or the show exhibit chairperson is final.

Exhibit rooms will be open for the placement of exhibits according to the time schedule set on the application or in the letter accompanying it. Each exhibitor is responsible for having his/her exhibit set up at the appointed time.

A small label will be affixed to each case denoting the number of the exhibit, the number of cases, and the group (category) in which it is entered.

The Exhibit chairperson will keep a full and complete record of all exhibits, showing the name of the exhibitor, the group (category), the ID number, and number of cases used. Names of the exhibitor will not be disclosed until the judges have made their reports to the chief judge, all reports are tallied and prepared, and winners and runner-up(s) have been determined. Exhibitors who wish to remain anonymous must inform the exhibits chairperson with the application.

Each SCNA display case will remain locked and sealed by the exhibit chairperson or assistant in the presence of the exhibitor. (The exhibit chairperson will keep the case keys until the exhibits are removed; or, the cases shall be locked and the keys shall be the responsibility of the exhibitor until the exhibit is removed.)

Security will be provided during the show times published. Exhibitors are advised the presence of security personnel or security systems do not constitute a guarantee against loss, a policy of insurance, or a promise to indemnify in the event of loss by fire, theft or other casualty.

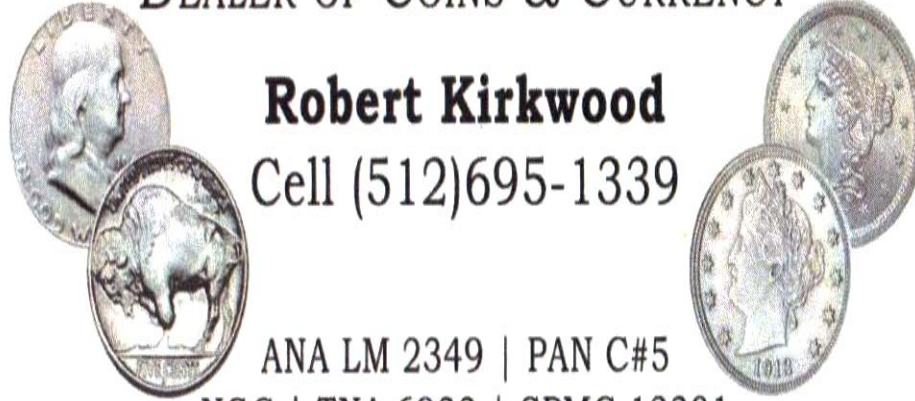
To be considered for an award the exhibit must be in the exhibit hall prior to the deadline set forth previously mentioned according to the time stated in the application letter.
