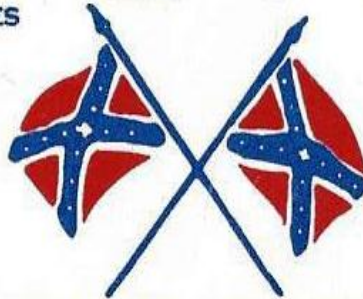

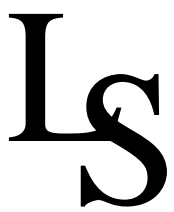

The YN Corner

Greetings Young Collectors!

Greetings Young Collectors and Happy New Year! I hope 2016 is your most successful and enjoyable year ever! By the time you read this article the newest America the Beautiful Quarter in the series should be entering circulation. Have you found any examples yet? The five new designs for this year are 1) the Shawnee National Forest, 2) Cumberland Gap National Historical Park, 3) Harper's Ferry National Historical Park, 4) Theodore Roosevelt National Park, and 5) Fort Moultrie National Monument. These places are in the following states- a) South Carolina, b) Kentucky, c) North Dakota, d) West Virginia, and e) Illinois. Can you match the coin with the state? (Answers: 1-e; 2-b; 3-d; 4-c; 5-a)

The U.S. Treasury is still considering putting a woman on currency in the near future. Some of the women being considered are Harriet Tubman, Eleanor Roosevelt, Sacagawea, Amelia Earhart, Wilma Mankiller, Martha Washington, and Susan B. Anthony. The decision on the person for this honor has not been made but it appears Alexander Hamilton will be replaced on the \$10.00 bill. Many people have expressed an opinion that Andrew Jackson on the \$20.00 bill should be the person replaced by a woman. However, the final decision will be made by the U.S. Treasury Secretary, Jack Lew. Comments on the subject can still be made on "#TheNew10".

Speaking of changes, one hundred years ago in 1916, the United States decided to make significant changes in the designs of its coinage with introduction of the Winged Liberty (Mercury Head) dime, Standing Liberty quarter, and the Walking Liberty half dollar. The existing coins were all designed in 1892 by the Mint's long-time chief engraver, Charles E. Barber, and shared the same basic, unpopular appearance. In 1890, Congress had passed legislation stating a coin's design could not be changed within 25 years unless authorized by Congress.

YN Corner Cont'd.

After 25 years the design of a coin could be changed with only the approval of the Secretary of the Treasury. In late 1915, the Mint Director decided the Barber designs must be changed (not could be changed). In early 1916 new design recommendations from Mint employees (mainly Charles E. Barber who was still head engraver) were sought but rejected. A special committee of three sculptors submitted designs for the three new coins. Initially the designs submitted by Adolph Weinman were chosen for the obverse and reverse of the dime, the obverse and reverse of the half dollar, and the reverse of the quarter. After some consideration the Mint officials awarded Hermon MacNeil the obverse and reverse of the quarter to lighten the work load on Weinman. After considerable delays from many changes to the sculptor's designs, illness, production problems and changes in Mint personnel, the Mint was running out of time to get the new coins made by the end of 1916. At one point the Mint personnel decided to make major changes to Hermon MacNeil's design without his approval. In early 1917 the sculptor found out about the unauthorized changes after he received quarters he ordered from the Mint. The Mint had to receive special legislation to allow MacNeil to redesign the coin he desired. Changes were made to cover Liberty's bare breast with chain mail on the obverse and stars were added below the eagle on the reverse. The early 1917 quarters are called type 1 and the changes made in mid-1917 are type 2.

While the Mint struggled to convert the new coin designs into dies that could produce acceptable circulating coinage, the demand for new small coins was very strong. The Mint had to produce millions of 1916-dated Barber dimes and quarters to meet public demand until the newly designed coins were ready for release. After all the problems and delays only the Winged Liberty dimes were actually released into circulation in October of 1916. With the Mint branches receiving working dies of the half dollar in November, 1916, Mint officials decided to hold the release of the 1916-dated half dollars until the first week of January, 1917. The new quarter design required so many changes only 52,000 new quarters could be made at the Philadelphia mint before the end of 1916. This was proof the Mint officials had produced all of the new coin designs by the end of 1916. The 1916 quarters were released for circulation the first week of January.

The public was generally very happy with the new designs. The Mercury Head dimes were produced from 1916 to 1945, the Standing Liberty quarter from 1916 to 1930

(no quarters were made in 1931 and Congress authorized the change of the design before 25 years of production to celebrate the 200th birthday of George Washington), and the Walking Liberty half dollar from 1916 to 1947.

In 1986 the popular Walking Liberty design was used again for the obverse of the new Silver Eagle bullion coins. For coin collectors the year 1916 was a very good year. The 1916 Standing Liberty quarter had the lowest mintage of 52,000 pieces for all 20th century circulating coins. These quarters are hard to find in any condition (dates of early Standing Liberty quarters wore off quickly) and are very expensive to purchase in any condition. No 1916 quarters were made in Denver or San Francisco. The 1916-D Winged Liberty (Mercury) dimes mintage of 264,000 makes this coin key to the series and expensive even in very low grades. The 1916-P and 1916-S Mercury dimes were produced in the millions and are available in most grades at reasonable prices. All 1916 Walking Liberty half dollars are low-mintage but are generally available in lower grades for \$100.00 or less.

The completed application and supporting documents for the 2017 scholarship must be received no later than December 31, 2016.

1921 Peace Rim Cuds Dr. David Close



Most collectors enjoy the idea of owning rare coins, especially within an organized set. To purchase a coin with less than 10 known, a collector may pay tens to hundreds of thousands of dollars for a well known rarity, or a few hundred to a few thousand for a rare die variety. As a variety type, rim cuds tend to be overlooked, even by variety collectors.

Within the Peace dollar series, there are probably over 100 known rim cud varieties. Giving a list of all known rim cuds is beyond the scope of this article, so I will start where Peace dollars start, 1921.

Rim cuds presently are not list able as VAM varieties per se, although there are several VAMs which had been listed for other features which have a rim cud. Those cuds which extend into the field may be list able, but none are known on 1921 Peace dollars.

All must be full thickness, at least 3 mm, with each end clearly discernible with the naked eye. While these criteria are arbitrary, they exclude many minor varieties. For now, I have not included the retained (rather than full) rim cuds other than the LDS VAM 1D (to show the characteristics) as they are minor, & there are quite a few of them (some of which can be difficult to distinguish), although some are ultra rare.

For those which are not the late die state (LDS) of a listed VAM variety, I have listed them using my own numbering system. Listed are the five best known to me for each of these. Best wishes to all who look for these, anyone who can complete even this short set is in elite group of collectors! If you find one which is not on this list, yet meets the above criteria, you will have found a very nice, and rare, coin; please post your find on www.VAMworld.com.

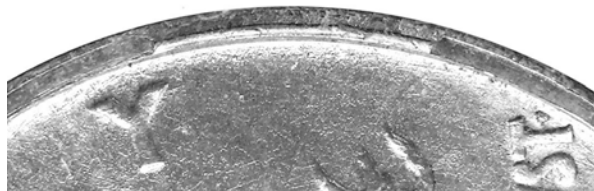

United States Mint Moves Forward with Plans to Commemorate 100th Anniversary of Three Iconic Coin Designs

WASHINGTON - The United States Mint announced on November 10, 2015, that it will strike and issue coins to commemorate the 100th anniversary of three iconic coin designs first issued in 1916: the "Winged Liberty" dime, "Standing Liberty" quarter, and "Walking Liberty" half-dollar. All three coins will be manufactured from .9999 fine, 24-karat gold.

To approximate the 1916 coin dimensions, the "Winged Liberty" dime will contain one-tenth troy ounce of 24-karat gold, the Standing Liberty quarter will contain one-quarter troy ounce of 24-karat gold, and the Walking Liberty half-dollar will contain one-half troy ounce of 24-karat gold.

The "Winged Liberty" dime, designed by Adolph A. Weinman, features a portrait of Liberty facing left and wearing a winged cap on its obverse (heads side). The design became known as the Mercury dime because of its resemblance to the Roman god, Mercury. The coin's reverse (tails side) includes a Roman fasces and an olive branch, representing America's military readiness and, simultaneously, its desire for peace. Additional inscriptions to the originals will include "AU" (the symbol for gold), "24K," and "1/10 OZ."

The Standing Liberty quarter, designed by Herman A. MacNeil, depicts Liberty on its obverse. She is holding a shield and an olive branch as she steps through an opening in a wall bearing 13 stars. The reverse shows an eagle in flight flanked by 13 stars. Additional inscriptions to the originals will include "AU," "24K," and "1/4 OZ."

The Walking Liberty half-dollar, also designed by Weinman, portrays Liberty on its obverse as she strides toward the sunrise, carrying branches of laurel and oak in her arms to symbolize both civil and military glory. Liberty wears a Phrygian cap on her head and an armored plate on her chest over her gown, with the American flag behind her. The reverse features an eagle rising from its mountaintop perch. Additional inscriptions to the originals will include "AU," "24K," and "1/2 OZ."

Details about mintage levels, on-sale dates, and pricing will be announced this year.

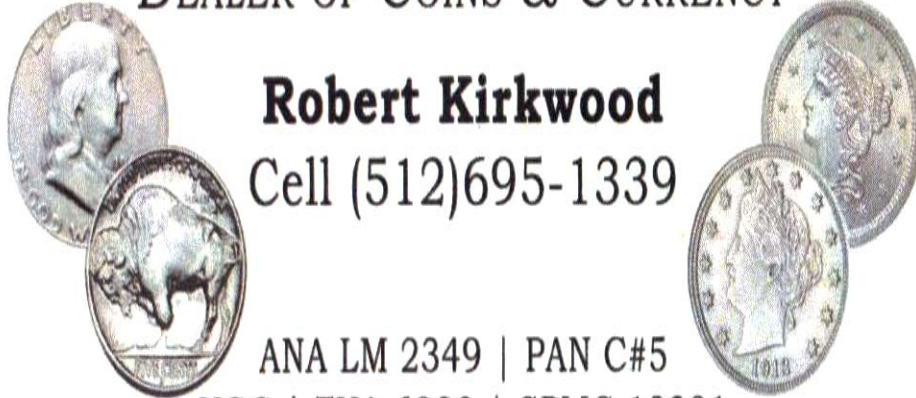
