

Changes to the 2010 SCNA By –Laws, as Approved by the SCNA Executive Board, to reflect the newly approved Ethics Review Process as:

Item 1: ARTICLE IX; Special Provisions; Section 1 currently states:

~~**Existing:** All Executive Board Members, appointed officials and members of the Association must abide by the SCNA By Laws and Code of Ethics.~~

Re-write approved by the SCNA Executive Board: All Executive Board Members, appointed officials and members of the Association must abide by the SCNA By Laws and Code of Ethics. The SCNA Executive Board shall evaluate and resolve allegations of SCNA Member ethical misconduct, in accordance with the SCNA Ethics Review Process Charter.

Item 2: ARTICLE IV, Members - Resignation-Suspension, Expulsion, Section 3, currently states:

Whenever written charges are brought against any member of conduct prejudicial to the welfare of the Association, the charges shall be signed by the person making them.

The identity of the person making the charges shall not be made known except to the Executive Board. These charges shall be filed with the President who shall furnish the accused member with a written copy.

The accused member shall be afforded a reasonable opportunity to enter a written defense to the charges.

~~The matter shall then be referred to the Executive Board, who shall determine the case under such rules and regulations as they may adopt.~~

Re-write approved by the SCNA Executive Board: The matter shall then be referred to an the Executive Board, who shall investigate the matter per the process described in the current version of the SCNA Ethic Review Process Charter, and under such rules and regulations as they may adopt.

The Executive Board may dismiss the charges, or it may censure, suspend, or expel the accused member. It may cause the result of its actions to be made public.

Until the final decision of the Executive Board, the accused member shall continue in good standing.

Changes to the 2010 SCNA Code of Ethics contained in the 2010 SCNA By-Laws, as Approved by the SCNA Executive Board:

A Member must agree to comply with the following standards of conduct:

- ~~Existing: To support and be governed by the By-Laws of the Association and by any other rules, policies and regulations as may be adopted from time to time by the Executive Board.~~
- **Re-write approved by the SCNA Executive Board: To support and be governed by the By-Laws of the Association and by any other rules, policies, charters, regulations, or other governance-related instruments as may be adopted from time to time by the Executive Board.**
- To conduct his/her self so as to bring no reproach or discredit to the SCNA, or impair the prestige of its membership.
- To conduct all numismatic dealings in a just, fair and moral manner and to make no false statements as to the condition of a numismatic item (altered, counterfeit, or otherwise) or in any other matter.
- ~~Existing: To neither buy or sell numismatic items of which the ownership is not clear.~~
- **Re-write approved by the SCNA Executive Board: To neither buy, sell, trade, give, or receive numismatic items of which the ownership is unclear or suspect.**
- ~~Existing: To abide by all local, state and federal laws in all numismatic matters and to assist in the prosecution of violators of such laws.~~
- **Re-write approved by the SCNA Executive Board: To abide by all local, state and federal laws; to assist cognizant authorities, if requested, in their investigation of alleged violation of any local, state or federal law.**
- ~~Existing: Any violation of this Code will be grounds for expulsion from SCNA under its then current rules.~~

- **Re-write approved by the SCNA Executive Board: Confirmed violation of this Code, as determined by the SCNA Ethics Review Process, will be grounds for disciplinary action of the SCNA Member, as defined in the SCNA By Laws.**
