## Silver Certificates of 1899

Beginning about the turn of the previous Century, the United States tended to produce notes in series that, conveniently for today's collector/investors makes it very feasible to begin a collection in a relatively simple fashion. In 1899 the Silver Certificate Series of notes were pretty much the everyday currency items used at the time. So needless to say a lot were produced, fortunate enough for today's collector that means only three denominations of notes to be collected. For the sake of this article we are only going to cover the three basic types, but for those of you who want completeness, and to collect by signature varieties, the series will be enough to keep you in the hunt for years.

The "Black Eagle" \$1.00 dated 1899 has several varieties beginning with Fr. 226, Lyons-Roberts signatures, and "series date above and to the right of the serial number." The only one like this type. This next group of notes encompasses a total of four different "Friedburg" Numbers thru Fr. 229 and beginning with Fr.226-a which has the "series date below the serial number." The last group of Black Eagle notes, also a variation, is the group which is numbered Fr-229a to Fr-236 with the "series dates to the right vertically." All in all any of these notes could serve as a type note, as the differences in most notes are very minor.



As for pricing, the Black Eagle Series is pretty affordable, and most collectors or investors would probably consider a note in Very Fine to Choice C.U. Pricing on this group of notes can be found in the GreenSheet where they will vary from \$126/140 in Very Fine to \$398/438 in Choice Uncirculated 63 (avg of all three Fr. # bid/ask ranges).

In moving along in this series, we now find the \$2.00 1899 also known as the Mechanics and Agriculture Note. A relatively scarce note that is fairly affordable. There are only ten Friedburg Numbers to be collected, from Fr. 249 thru Fr. 258. If you're only going for a type note, there are no varieties, and only one note would be needed to finish the set. There is only one rare signature combination to be bought if you are getting all the notes in this series and that is Fr-254 the Napier-Thompson, a pretty scarce note. If you are only wanting one for the Type then a Fr.258 which is the Speelman-White signature is needed for the type, which in Very Fine could be found at or near the GreenSheet price of \$ 165/180 or if you prefer a nicer note, you could secure one in Choice Uncirculated 63 for about \$825/900 which is just about the GreenSheet Price if you did a little searching out there at the Shows and various Auctions.



Of course to complete the set of three notes you have to have a \$5.00 1899 Indian Chief in the set to make it complete. Some collectors, swear that the \$5.00 Indian Chief is THE nicest note the United States ever printed, which may be the case. It is always one that every Collector or Investor wants or has to have in their collection. The Indian's name pictured on the front of this cool note is named, Tatoka-Inyanka, or in English it translates to "Running Antelope" in our language. He was of the Hunkpapa Sioux Tribe, which gives this note a rather odd nickname of "Unk Papa" most people believe it is the Indian's true name but instead it is the Tribe's name but somehow the name has stuck to the note instead of "Running Antelope" most just call it the "Chief".

This is a series of no less than eleven Friedburg Numbers, and the numbers run from Fr-271 to Fr-281. There is a rather tough note in this group if one is going to obtain all signature combinations, it is the Napier-Thompson. Most if not all of the signature combinations can be found in about every grade. About all that every collector could want in this note could be obtained in an affordable grade of Very Fine, and a really decent note for the typical collector might be an Extra Fine which could be obtained for the GreenSheet price of \$975/1075 or thereabouts, for the more affluent investor and well heeled collector a very nice Choice to Gem Uncirculated could be bought for \$2100/2300 which is right at the GreenSheet price for a CU 63. There are no real varieties in the \$5.00 1899 series, but if you wanted to get inventive you could find there are some mule notes available to collect that are not too expensive. But we can save that for other articles.

# **Greetings Young Collectors!**

Have you received any 2016-dated coins from circulation yet? For me this activity has been very difficult so far. I have found ten 2016-P cents and two 2016-P nickels. No dimes, no quarters and no Denver mint coins. End of story. Perhaps my search for the elusive new coins will improve during the year. Please feel free to contact me to report any unusual or interesting coins from your change.

The Fort Moultrie National Monument quarter launch is scheduled for Thursday, November 17, 2016, at 10:30 AM at Fort Moultrie, Sullivan's Island, SC. Information on the Fort Moultrie quarter release ceremony can be found on the SCNA website: **SC-NA.ORG**. In what year was the last South Carolina quarter released? (Answer: The South Carolina state quarter released in 2000).

I have written in previous columns that the U.S. Treasury was considering putting a woman on currency and public comments were being sought. In a previously unreported memo to the President in March, 2015, Mr. Jack Lew, the U.S. Secretary of the Treasury expressed his thoughts that Susan B. Anthony should be the new face on the \$10.00 but he wanted to hear from the public before he made a final decision. A special website for comments was established just for this purpose. Many early reports expressed the opinion that the \$20.00 bill with Andrew Jackson should be changed instead of the \$10.00 bill. Well, in April, 2016 Secretary Lew made some surprising announcements.

First, Harriet Tubman will replace Andrew Jackson on the front of the \$20.00 bill. She will be the first real woman to appear on a banknote in over 100 years and the first African American to ever appear on currency. Jackson's likeness will be moved to the back of the bill. The \$20.00 note was not scheduled to be redesigned until 2030 but Mr. Lew has requested the date be moved to at least 2020. The year 2020 will mark the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of women receiving the right to vote.

Next, Alexander Hamilton will remain on the front of the \$10.00 bill. It was reported Mr. Lew made his decision to leave Hamilton on the \$10 after he saw the smash Broadway musical based on Hamilton.

It was also noted the backs of the current \$10.00 and \$5.00 notes are being changed to include portraits of famous civil rights figures. The new \$10.00 note is currently scheduled to be released in 2020 with new security features, enhancements for the blind, and the redesigned reverse. The actual date for a release of the popular Abraham Lincoln \$5.00 bill with a new reverse was not reported but may also come as early as 2020.

While Mr. Lew was announcing the many changes to the U.S. currency, more interesting information was disclosed from his March, 2015 memo on the nation's money. Mr. Lew advised he supported the removal of the one cent coin. He also stated the composition of the rest of the U.S. coins should be considered for change. No action has been taken on Mr. Lew's recommendations to revamp the U.S. coinage but it was expected there would be much opposition from the manufacturers of the metals currently being used for coins if changes are enacted.

There are many actual and possible changes being discussed for our money designs and composition for the next few years. Do not be surprised if the government makes even more changes when you least expect it. Keep reading the **SCanner** while we try to keep you current on the changes.

# United States Mint Obtains Possession of Aluminum Coin

Washington, DC - The United States Mint announced today that it has recovered a 1974-D aluminum experimental one-cent specimen that was neither authorized to be struck nor authorized to leave the Mint. The Mint's recovery follows an agreement to resolve a lawsuit over the ownership of the piece.

The lawsuit in question involved an aluminum one-cent specimen that had once been in the apparent possession of a former assistant superintendent at the United States Mint in Denver, Colo. The two plaintiffs, an heir of the former assistant superintendent and a California coin dealer, filed suit in federal District Court in San Diego, California, seeking a declaratory judgment that the piece was legal to own.

Over 1.4 million of the experimental pieces were struck at the Mint in Philadelphia in 1974 as part of a test program to possibly replace copper one-cent coins. However, Congress never enacted legislation authorizing the Mint to issue one-cent coins composed of aluminum, and the test pieces were to all be melted. The specimen piece in question bears a "D" mark, signifying production in Denver, along with the date "1974," and appears to have been struck with a die intended for the Mint's Denver facility. However, authority was never granted for production of the experimental test pieces at Denver.

An heir of the now-deceased former assistant superintendent contended that his father was given the aluminum one-cent specimen as a gift upon his retirement. The heir provided the piece to an auction firm and hoped to sell it. In February 2014, the United States Mint became aware of plans to offer this particular piece for auction, and immediately reached out to the plaintiffs, notifying both that the United States Mint never issued, nor otherwise transferred title to any aluminum one-cent piece, and that indeed, lawful authority to issue them was never granted. Congress never divested the Government's interest in the subject aluminum one-cent piece, and accordingly, it remained the rightful property of the Federal government.

The Mint, upon authorization of the Secretary of the Treasury and as delegated by Congress, has the exclusive authority to mint and issue U.S. coins and other numismatic items. Items made at United States Mint facilities but not lawfully issued--or otherwise lawfully

disposed of--remain government property and are not souvenirs that Mint officials can remove and pass down to their heirs.

The agreement directs that title to the piece rests with the United States Mint and that it be transferred to its custody and control. Mint Police have secured the piece. The Mint considers the specimen to be a valuable historic heritage asset. Accordingly, it intends to display the specimen publicly so that this heritage asset can be properly showcased and enjoyed by numismatists, coin collectors and the general public. The display forum has not yet been decided, but the Mint will make an announcement when a decision has been made.

"The Mint is very pleased with the agreement, and we are very grateful to the U.S. Attorney's Office in San Diego for its work and efforts in reaching this resolution. We look forward to displaying the coin appropriately as an important Mint heritage asset," said Rhett Jeppson, United States Mint Principal Deputy Director. "This agreement is not only good for the integrity of the coin collecting hobby but for the integrity of the government property and rule of law."



- The exhibit application(s) must reach the address of the responsible person on the application by the date specified.
- SCNA officers, judges of exhibits, or their families shall not place judged exhibits. Non-competitive exhibits are permitted for these persons.
- All materials in exhibits must be authentic. Any replicas, forgeries, or counterfeit materials must be labeled as such.
- Exhibits may not advertise any contents for sale or have any statement of price or value. There will be no identification as to ownership or reference to the person displaying the material submitted for display.
- Up to 4 exhibit cases may be provided by the SCNA to exhibitors for use at the convention.
- Exhibitors may use their own cases provided total space does not exceed space of 4 SCNA cases.
- All cases must lie flat on the tables provided.
- No electrical outlets will be provided.
- No titles or placards or numismatic material of any kind may be placed outside the exhibit cases.
- Exhibits of material not capable of being presented in the usual cases will be permitted only upon prior and specific arrangement with the exhibit chairperson and subject to the concurrence of the executive board chairperson (President).
- In the event of any question of the legality of any material submitted for display, the decision of the SCNA President or the show exhibit chairperson is final.
- Exhibit rooms will be open for the placement of exhibits according to the time schedule set on the application or in the letter accompanying it. Each exhibitor is responsible for having his/her exhibit set up at the appointed time.


- A small label will be affixed to each case denoting the number of the exhibit, the number of cases, and the group (category) in which it is entered.
- The Exhibit chairperson will keep a full and complete record of all exhibits, showing the name of the exhibitor, the group (category), the ID number, and number of cases used. Names of the exhibitor will not be disclosed until the judges have made their reports to the chief judge, all reports are tallied and prepared, and winners and runner-up(s) have been determined. Exhibitors who wish to remain anonymous must inform the exhibits chairperson with the application.
- Each SCNA display case will remain locked and sealed by the exhibit chairperson or assistant in the presence of the exhibitor. (The exhibit chairperson will keep the case keys until the exhibits are removed; or, the cases shall be locked and the keys shall be the responsibility of the exhibitor until the exhibit is removed.)
- Security will be provided during the show times published. Exhibitors
  are advised the presence of security personnel or security systems do
  not constitute a guarantee against loss, a policy of insurance, or a
  promise to indemnify in the event of loss by fire, theft or other
  casualty.
- To be considered for an award the exhibit must be in the exhibit hall prior to the deadline of Saturday 12 pm.
- The decision of the exhibit judges is final. The award will be presented
  at a scheduled ceremony scheduled by the SCNA President and the
  board members.
