### Chuck Goergen Presents "Elvira Elisa Clain-Stefanelli's Legacy" By Stephen Kuhl

"Have you ever heard of Mrs. Elvira Elisa Clain-Stefanelli?" This was the question posed by Chuck Goergen at a recent meeting of the Stephen James Central Savannah River Area Coin Club in Aiken, South Carolina. According to Chuck she has "affected every coin collector in the room".

Wow, that was some statement, and no small feat! As a member of the audience that night, I was not sure of this claim. In fact, I had never heard of this lady, so, on the surface, one might consider this assertion to be a bit of hyperbole. Perhaps it was not? As Chuck gave his presentation it quickly became clear that his declaration was true.

His presentation began with a history of this icon of the numismatic world.

She was born in Romania in the early part of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century; She experienced, on a very personal level, both World Wars - to include spending approximately three years in the Buchenwald concentration camp with her husband Vladimir. It was noted that her husband was an internationally renowned and highly acclaimed numismatist. Perhaps they can be considered the first "power couple" of coin collecting!

As explained by Chuck, following the end of the Second World War Mrs. And Mr. Clain-Stefanelli immigrated to the United States. In 1956 they became the Curators of the National Numismatic Collection. This collection is held at the National Museum of American History in the Smithsonian Institution at Washington, D.C. Together, over many years, they helped expand this collection from 60,000 items to over 900,000! The current collection contains over a million items.

One of the Clain-Stefanelli's achievements discussed by Mr. Goergen was that in 1968 they obtained (for the Smithsonian) 6,125 coins from the collection of pharmaceutical magnate Josiah K. Lilly. At the time this was one of the largest collections of domestic, foreign and ancient gold coins ever assembled, and was valued at \$5.5 million (\$24.8 million in 2018 dollars).

Unfortunately Mr. Clain-Stefanelli passed away in 1982. However, Mrs. Clain-Stefanelli continued her work, and became the Executive Director of the Smithsonian's Coin Department. In addition to her duties as a Curator of the National Numismatic Collection, Mrs. Clain-Stefanelli was a prolific author.

She wrote many books on a multitude of numismatic topics, to include the tome *Numismatic Bibliography*, which, as its name implies, provided a comprehensive history of numismatics.

Mr. Goergen brought several of the books written by Mrs. Clain-Stefanelli for the Club members to review. At the end of the presentation he graciously placed one of the books up for auction, which resulted in a short but spirited bidding spree.

In addition to the books, Mr. Goergen brought some coins for the audience to look at. One very special item he had was a beautifully brilliant Roman Denarius, circa 211 – 206 BC, which was once owned by Mrs. Clain-Stefanelli (see Figure below). Obtaining a coin from her collection was "a dream come true" for Chuck! The coin was accompanied by a certificate of authenticity citing the Ex-Clain-Stefanelli attribution.

Chuck wrapped up his presentation by sharing the story of when he had the good fortune to personally meet Mrs. Clain-Stefanelli. Chuck had a cousin who was a Fellow with

the American Numismatic Society and knew Mrs. Clain-Stefanelli. Cousin arranged for he and Chuck to have a private tour of the Smithsonian's collection and a "meet and greet" with her. They were taken to the non-public vault area and a Curator brought them a platter labelled "America's Rarest Coins". They

were able to handle and examine these very rare coins, to include one of the two 1804 US Dollars in the collection! (Chuck said the full story of that tour will have to be a separate presentation. We can hardly wait to hear!) Following their inspection of America's rarest coins, Mrs. Clain-Stefanelli spent time chatting with them about numismatics.

In a 1996 profile piece, The Numismatist magazine, (published by the American Numismatic Association) called her "a remarkable treasure in the world of numismatics." Given the fascinating story of her life as presented by Chuck, it is easy to understand this characterization and to recognize that her legacy endures.

### **Camden Coin Club News**



### **YN Corner - Starting a Coin Collection**

In this section you will learn step-by-step about **starting a coin collection** and continue on to learn all you need to know to become a successful coin collector. You **can** start your own coin collection with the coins you receive in change on a daily basis while you are learning all the ins and outs of the hobby **at the same time**. That way, you can actually get a taste of coin collecting without worrying about spending a lot of money or taking a chance of actually losing money.

### First Step - Start Your Own Coin Collection

If you are just **starting a coin collection** the best place to start is with coins from circulation. When you start a coin collection with coins from your pocket or purse, you don't have any risk. For

instance, after a while, if you find that coin collecting is not for you, you can just spend the coins. <u>State Quarters</u> are the most frequently chosen coin series for people

starting a coin collection. In fact, this particular series is responsible for bringing thousands of new coin collectors into the hobby. The series has lots of interesting coins since each state's coin has a unique design and they are perfect for someone just starting a coin collection.




Another great series for starting a

**coin collection** is the <u>Presidential Dollar Series</u>. Although, in my experience, this series of coins is not as widely available in circulation as the state quarters. If you are interested in collecting Presidential Dollars, you can check with your bank to see which coins they have available, or you can search eBay or <u>Amazon</u>. Presidential Dollar coins for the current year can be found on the <u>U.S. Mint's site</u>. You may also decide that you want to start your collecting hobby with <u>Lincoln Cents</u>, <u>Jefferson Nickels</u>, or <u>Roosevelt Dimes</u>.

### So, here is how you start your own coin collection:

Start saving coins from the change you receive for everyday purchases. It could be State Quarters, Presidential dollars, or

whatever series of coins you decide to star with. It is best to narrow your focus when *just starting a coin collection*. If you try to collect too many different series at once, you may overwhelmed. After you get a few coins together, you might want to purchase an inexpensive album to keep the coins organized. They are available with a slot for each coin that you will need to complete the set, and they will work fine for circulated coins. Find a good <u>reference book</u>, search the Internet or subscribe to some weekly and monthly <u>publications</u> about



the area of coin collecting that you are most interested in. You might want to start with a book about <u>State Quarters</u> or <u>Presidential Dollars</u>, or just US coins in general and begin studying.

Knowledge is the Key to Success in coin collecting as it is in just about any other hobby or area of interest you pursue. If you don't take the time to educate yourself, you run the risk of wasting a lot of money on coins that are either over-graded, counterfeit or have some other problem. So, please take the time to educate

yourself while you are enjoying your first taste of coin collecting with a fun collection of coins from circulation.

If your collection is not growing as fast as you would like it to, you can purchase rolls of coins from your local bank. Sort through the coins and find the ones you need to complete the set, then take the ones you don't need back to the bank and start the process all over again.

As your collection is growing, continue to learn all you can about coins and coin collecting so that when you are ready to increase your collection to include more rare and valuable coins you will have the knowledge and confidence to know that you are also making a good investment.

Start small when you are **starting a coin collection** and then work your way up to more valuable coins as your knowledge increases. Learn all about modern coins and their history, then work your way back to older and rare coins. Get a solid foundation before you spend much money.

Just remember, **starting a coin collection** is not hard. In fact, it can be quite fun and educational. And there are no set rules about what your collection should contain. The most important thing is to have fun with it.

# Collecting the Coronet \$5 Half Eagles – Or at Least the Common Ones By Mark Benvenuto

When it comes to building a great coin collection, the king of the metals is undoubtedly gold. Throughout history, coins have been made from copper, silver, or gold – with some brass and other alloy coins thrown in there as well. But of the three elemental metals, gold is always used for the coins of highest value. This all sounds wonderful and rather historic, but the fly in the ointment for many of us wanting to collect is the prices. Gold is always expensive compared to the other two.

Keeping the price of gold in mind, it is worth looking about to see if there are any series of gold coins that might be collectible, even though we know the price tags will never be chump change. A quick look lands us at the Coronet \$5 gold pieces that were issued and used in the United States from 1839 all the way up to 1908.

The design work for the Coronet gold pieces – for they were made as \$2.50 quarter eagles, \$5 half eagles, and \$10 eagles right from the beginning – is that of Mint Engraver Christian Gobrecht. For the first full decade of their production as half eagles, there are not too many dates or mint marks we could consider common today; so let's look at this collection from the other end. Let's start with the twentieth century issues.

Issued up to 1908, there are eighteen different dates and mint-marks from which to choose, if we make the year 1900 our start point. All are now well over one hundred years old, making them real pieces of U.S. history. Nine are from the main Mint in Philadelphia, seven are from the West Coast branch Mint at San Francisco, and the other two are the only two years of issue for these gold pieces from the branch Mint in Denver. Three of these eighteen dates saw mintages of more than a million coins, with the 1901-S being the most common by far, with just over 3.6 million as its official total. So, if we want to start a collection here, what is the baseline cost for each piece?

As this is being written, many of the common date Coronet \$5 gold pieces cost about \$450 in MS-60. While that's not a great number in terms of a grade for a mint state coin, it does represent a piece that shows no wear. If the cost induces a bit of sticker shock, let's do some basic math. First and obviously, these are gold coins, and so will never be the stuff of bargain bins. Second, each contains 0.24187 ounces of gold, so when gold metal on the world markets is \$1,300 per ounce, there is \$314.43 of gold in each coin – meaning there is only \$135 of the price that is above and beyond the cost of the gold. Third, and perhaps most importantly, the price of one of these coins in a grade as low as fine, or F-12, is still about \$400. So for that extra \$50, you are getting a much better coin.

Armed with these figures, \$450 might still be more than we normally spend on a single coin. If that is the case, well, it's time to save up. If we are brutally honest with ourselves, we will probably find there is some waste in our daily spending. It may take a month or two to gather an extra \$450, but it's not an impossible goal.

In that run from 1900 until the end of the series, we'll find that there are a few dates or mint marks that are scarce enough that they will not ring in at the price we just mentioned. It's worth a sigh or two, but it's probably best to move on. After all, in building this type of collection, it is not as if we are trying to fill holes in pre-cut cardboard sheets. We have to expect a few missing dates or mint marks.

Keeping our base price in mind, a serious glance through any of the major price lists shows us that we can probably stick to that price all the way back to 1879. That's fascinating really, as the 1879 official mint tally is 301,920 coins. Admittedly, this mintage is not a super rare half eagle, but the 1880, for example, has a mintage of 3.1 million and costs the same, at least at the MS-60 grade and any below it.

What we might call this discrepancy in the prices of half eagles exists for a very simple reason: not many people collect an entire date run or date and mint mark run of any United States gold coin series.

The perception is that it is just too expensive. Most people therefore stick to something like assembling a type set of U.S. gold coins. Start with one each of the quarter eagle, half eagle, eagle, and double eagle (if that last one is within the budget). Perhaps that quartet can be expanded with a one-dollar gold piece and a three-dollar piece. But since that is where many of us stop, this influences the market, keeping the price down for some half eagles that may be worth a bit more. That then means pieces such as the 1879 become quite the bargain. There may be others as well.



If you have read this far, and are still uncertain about the possibility of forming a collection of Coronet \$5 gold pieces, keep two tips in mind. Number one: purchase what you can afford, but nothing higher. If it takes a few months to save up for even one of these half eagles, that's okay. Good collections do take time. Number two: keep in mind that this hobby is supposed to be fun. Don't let the quest for a specific date or mint mark detract from the overall collection you are building.

Overall, if we have never collected coins that cost at least \$450 each, this first foray into gold might seem a bit daunting. But if we stick to a budget, and keep in mind that we are building a collection that is fun as well as historical, this jump into the deep end can be a jump into a wonderful new aspect of numismatics.

### SCNA 46<sup>th</sup> Annual Convention Letter from Bourse Chairman Bill Latour

The 2018 SCNA Convention is back in Greenville at the TD Convention center. Well sort of, same place and same convention hall, however the TD Convention Center is being renamed the Greenville Convention Center effective October 1<sup>st</sup>. As of April 28<sup>th</sup>, 103 tables have already been confirmed for the show. Despite Baltimore having scheduled their fall show the same weekend, we are well on our way to having a full bourse floor.
